- On behalf of the 21,000 members of the Ohio chapter of the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), you are respectfully urged to **VOTE YES on Senate Bill 8 (McColley)**
- Senate Bill 8 establishes the Residential Broadband Expansion Grant Program. This important bill creates a public-private partnership to deliver broadband internet service to unserved and underserved areas of Ohio.
- Ohio employers are competing in a global environment. To do so, they need well-educated individuals to fill the jobs of today and tomorrow. Without adequate internet access, many children, tomorrow's workforce, will be left behind. This hurts their future employability, the success of our small businesses, the local economies, as well as Ohio's overall economic success as the pool of qualified and educated workers, is diminished simply by one's geographic location.
- Employers are providing increased flexibility for employees to work from home and the need for reliable broadband is greater.
