October 9, 2022: Voter registration deadline.

Voting

Early and absentee voting are options available to all voters.

October 29, 2022: Early voting and in-person absentee voting begins. Deadline to request absentee ballot.

November 7, 2020: Deadline to request online or fax ballot

November 8, 2022: Election Day, deadline to return electronic absentee ballots, and deadline to postmark mailed absentee ballots.

ID Requirements

A valid form of identification is required to vote.

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
