#### **NFIB OPPOSES Constitutional Amendment 1.**

Amendment 1 would create a state constitutional right, beyond the National Labor Relations Act, for employees to organize and bargain collectively over "wages, hours, and working conditions and to protect their economic welfare and safety at work." This would effectively prohibit the Illinois legislature from passing a state "Right to Work" law that would prohibit union membership as a condition of employment.

### **Registration Deadlines**

October 11: Received by post office October 23: Online

Grace period voter registration starts Oct. 12, 2022 and runs through Election Day.

## Voting

Voting by mail is an option available to all voters.

September 29: In-person early voting begins.

November 3: Deadline to request a mail ballot.

**November 7:** In-person early voting ends.

**November 8:** Election Day and deadline to return absentee ballot by mail.

### **ID Requirements**

Identification is not required to vote at the polls. However, valid ID is required for first time voters or if registration is incomplete.

### **Polling Place Details**

Polling places are open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
