Voting

Voting advance by mail is an option available to all voters.

October 19, 2022: First day advance mail ballots are mailed and advance in-person voting may begin.

November 1, 2022: Deadline for voters to apply for advance mail ballot.

November 7, 2022: Advance in-person voting ends.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline of close of polls to return advance mail ballot.

ID Requirements

State law requires Kansas voters to show photo identification when casting a vote in person.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

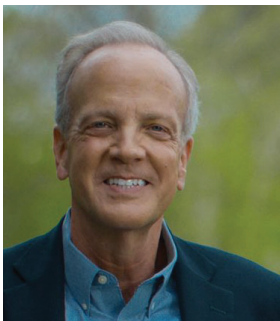

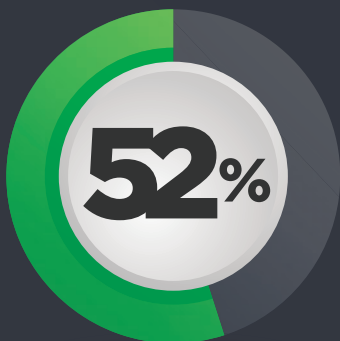
