Absentee ballots are available for voters with a valid excuse.

October 25, 2022: Early voting begins at 8:30 a.m.

November 1, 2022: Early voting ends 6:00 p.m.

November 4, 2022: Deadline to request absentee ballot by 4:30 p.m.

November 7, 2022: Deadline to return absentee ballot by 4:30 p.m.

ID Requirements

Identification is required for all voters.

Polling Place Details

Election Day voting hours are from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on all Saturday elections and 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.

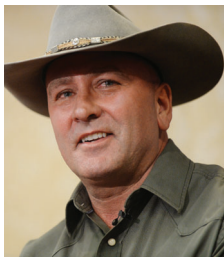
