Register

October 29, 2022: Deadline of 8:00 p.m. to register to vote.

Voting

Massachusetts voters now have the option to vote early by mail in all elections, with no excuse required.

October 22, 2022: Early voting begins.

November 1, 2022: Deadline of 5:00 p.m. to request a mail-in ballot.

November 4, 2022: Early voting ends.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline of 8:00 p.m. to return mail-in ballot.

ID Requirements

You may be asked to show identification if you are voting for the first time, an inactive voter, or if you are casting a provisional or challenged ballot.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
