Voting

Voting absentee is an option available to all voters.

October 27, 2022: Early voting begins at 7:00 a.m.

November 1, 2022: Deadline to request absentee ballot by mail by 8:00 p.m.

November 3, 2022: Early voting ends at 8:00 p.m.

November 4, 2022: Deadline to request absentee ballot online by 11:59 p.m.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline to return absentee ballot in-person by 8:00 p.m.

ID Requirements

First time voters in Maryland will be asked to show ID before voting.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
