Voting absentee is an option available to all voters.

October 27, 2022: Early voting begins at 7:00 a.m.

**November 1, 2022:** Deadline to request absentee

ballot by mail by 8:00 p.m.

**November 3, 2022:** Early voting ends at 8:00 p.m.

**November 4, 2022:** Deadline to request absentee

ballot online by 11:59 p.m.

**November 8, 2022:** Election Day and deadline to return absentee ballot in-person by 8:00 p.m.

# **ID Requirements**

First time voters in Maryland will be asked to show ID before voting.

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
