Register

October 24, 2022: Deadline for voter registration applications to be postmarked or submitted online. Election Day voter registration is also available.

Voting

No-excuse absentee ballots are available to all eligible and registered voters.

November 4, 2022: Deadline of 5:00 p.m. to request an absentee ballot online or by mail.

November 7, 2022: Early voting ends and deadline of 4:00 p.m. to request an absentee ballot in person.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline of 8:00 p.m. to return absentee ballot.

ID Requirements

Identification is required for all voters.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
