**October 18, 2022:** Online registration deadlines is 11:59 p.m. and paper application deadline is 5:00 p.m.

\*Election Day voter registration is also available.

## Voting

Voting absentee is an option available to all voters.

**September 23, 2022:** Early voting begins.

**November 7, 2022:** Early voting ends and deadline to request absentee ballots.

**November 8, 2022:** Election Day and deadline to return mailed ballots.

## ID Requirements

If your voter registration is current and active, you do not need to bring identification.

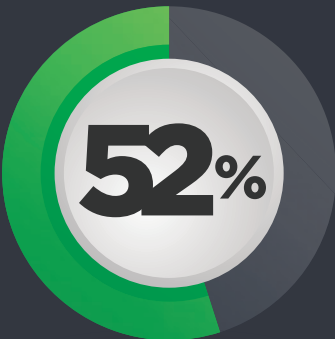
