Voting

There are no requirements for voting early or by absentee ballot.

October 20, 2022: Early voting begins.

November 1, 2022: Absentee ballot request

deadline.

October 5, 2022: Early voting ends.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline of 5:00 p.m. to return absentee ballots in-person. Absentee ballots postmarked by Nov. 8, 2022, must be received by Nov. 11, 2022

Photo ID is not required.

Polling places are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
