Absentee ballots for all other North Dakota residents (domestic voters) are made available on the 40th day before the General Election.

Early voting may be available from October 24 through November 7 – contact your local Elections Office

September 29: Absentee and mail balloting begins

November 7: Deadline to request absentee ballots and deadline to return postal absentee ballots.

ID Requirements

Identification is required for all voters.

Polling Place Details

Polling places open between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and close between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. depending on your location. Polling hours are based off local time zones.
