

#### **Registration Deadline**

**October 21:** Online, postmarked, or at DMV and other state agencies.

**October 28:** 6:00 p.m. deadline for in-person registration.

#### **Voting**

Voting by mail is an option available to all voters upon application.

October 9: In-person early voting begins.

October 28: Absentee ballot request deadline

**November 8:** Election Day and in-person early voting ends

#### **ID Requirements**

Nebraska does not require voters to present identification while voting. First-time voters who registered by mail and did not provide identification will be asked for an ID on Election Day.

#### **Polling Place Details**

Polling places are open from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. CT and from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. MT.
