October 11, 2022: Registration Deadline

## **Voting**

All Ohio voters whose registration information is up-to -date will have the opportunity to vote in any election from the convenience of their own homes by requesting an absentee ballot.

October 12, 2022: Early voting begins at 8:00 a.m.

**November 5, 2022:** Deadline to request absentee ballot by 12:00 p.m.

**November 7, 2022:** Early voting ends at 5:00 p.m. Deadline for absentee ballot to by postmarked.

**November 8, 2022:** Deadline for absentee ballot to be returned in-person (by close of polls).

## **ID Requirements**

Identification is required for all voters when voting in-person.

## **Polling Place Details**

Polling places are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
