**October 18, 2022:** Voter registration deadline.

## Important Dates

All registered voters will be sent ballots via mail two to three weeks prior to Election Day.

Ballots must have post mark date showing that the ballot was mailed on or before Election Day.

All ballots must be received or mailed with a valid postmark by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day
