October 24, 2022

Voting

There are no requirements for an absentee ballot, voting by mail is an option available to all voters.

November 1, 2022: Last day to request a mail-in or absentee ballot.

November 8, 2022: Last day for County Boards of Elections to receive voted mail-in and civilian absentee ballots (must be received by 8:00 P.M.)

November 15, 2022: Last day for County Board of Elections to receive voted military and overseas absentee ballots (submitted for delivery no later than 11:59 P.M. on November 7)

ID Requirements

When voting at a polling place for the first time, you must show proof of identification.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
