Register

October 7, 2022: Deadline to register to vote in-person.

October 11, 2022: Deadline to register to vote online or by mail.

Voting

Absentee voting allows qualified voters to cast a ballot by mail prior to Election Day. In-person early voting is also available.

October 24, 2022: Early voting begins at 8:30 a.m.

October 28, 2022: Deadline of 5:00 p.m. to request an absentee ballot.

November 5, 2022: Early voting ends at 6:00 p.m.

November 8, 2022: Election Day and deadline of 7:00 p.m. to return your absentee ballot.

ID Requirements

Photo ID is required for all voters.

Polling Place Details:

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

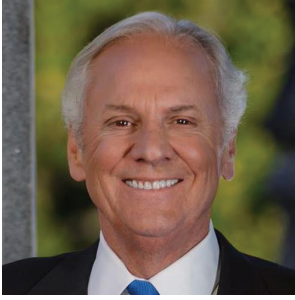
