October 11, 2022: Registration deadline

Voting

Mail ballots are available for voters with a valid excuse.

October 24, 2022: Early voting begins.

October 28, 2022: Deadline to apply for a mail ballot.

November 4, 2022: Early voting ends.

Mail ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, November 8 at 7:00 p.m. and received by Wednesday, November 9 at 5:00 p.m.

ID Requirements

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
