October 31, 2022: Mail or Online

November 8, 2022: In-person

Voting

Washington is an all vote-by-mail state. Ballots are sent to voters 18 days before an election.

October 21, 2022: Start of 18-day voting period (through Election Day). Ballots are mailed out and Accessible Voting Units (AVUs) are available at voting centers.

November 8, 2022: Election Day. Ballots must be returned in-person by 8:00 p.m. or mailed and postmarked by this date.

ID Requirements

Identification is required for voter registration.

Polling Place Details

Washington is an only mail-in ballot state and does not have polling places. Visit VoteWA.gov to find a ballot drop box location and for more information.
