

Registration Deadline

October 18: Voter registration deadline.

Voting

In West Virginia, certain registered voters may receive and vote an absentee ballot by mail. Please contact your local elections office for absentee voting eligibility.

October 26: Early voting begins

November 2: Deadline to request an absentee ballot.

November 5: Early voting ends

November 7: Deadline to return absentee ballot by hand.

November 14: Deadline for post office to receive Nov. 8 postmarked absentee ballot.

ID Requirements

West Virginia voters must show an approved form of identification at the polls during early voting or on election day.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
